ACTIVITY REPORT

Primary schools who benefitted from this Educational facility have expressed gratitude towards the assistance ZimRelief has provided to their schools. Forty pupils on benefit have different natures of vulnerability and were selected from different grades at each school. Challenges faced by the pupils include lack of school fees, lack of clothing – others have no school uniforms. These primary schools are facing challenges of not receiving BEAM money from the government. This amount is essential as it helps schools to run their activities well without facing financial constraints.

Glen Forest has students who also benefitted from fees coming from ZimRelief. Thanks to ZimRelief for this wonderful support. The fund has benefitted 25 primary school going children who are coming at the centre for their studies. These children are in three levels of grades 1-3, grades 4-5 and grades 6-7. These students are purely from the farming communities of Glen Forest and others are coming from Hatcliffe extension.

Five students on Scholarships for examinations received \$70.00 each towards their examinations fees. They are seating for the November examinations and there are 3 girls and 2 boys. Results would be available for distribution once ZIMSEC release them next year. Glen Forest Centre is under surveillance after a scandal that took place of three teachers who assisted to write an examination of a private candidate on both 25 October and 1 November 2016 respectively. The three teachers and Augustine Thomas Mabvuregudo, Patrick Kolopa and Stuart Munaka are now serving community service at Hatcliffe Polyclinic, Hatcliffe High school and Hatcliffe Primary School consecutively.

HIV/AIDS workshop was conducted very well. See separate report covering this aspect.

Last but not least, the bookkeeper is also an important tool for the monitoring of ZimRelief funds. He is a good accountant who is also working for Glen Forest Main accounting system.
